CLUB HISTORY

The Fallbrook Woman's Club (FWC), originally called the Saturday Afternoon Club, was founded in 1907 by a group of 15 women who came to Fallbrook from diverse backgrounds. The common bond of the founding members was their dedication to community improvements through volunteer service. They quickly became an important influence in our village.

In 1917 the Club sponsored the first Girl Scout Troop (White Rose Troop No.1) west of the Mississippi. In 1919 the Club founded the first public library, which was housed at our clubhouse.

During World Wars I & II, members were involved in the care of hospitalized servicemen, contributed countless hours to the American Red Cross, organized the local U.S.O. and offered first aid classes. During the Vietnam War, a blood bank was maintained at our clubhouse.

1951 was a monumental year for the Fallbrook Woman's Club, as members purchased the present site and held an Open House in October. They also happily accepted an 1872 surrey, donated by the Heald family. This surrey has become a village landmark.

Early records attest to the many activities and philanthropies in which members were involved. The Club fostered self-improvement, encouraged education and volunteered countless hours to schools, churches, clinics and the hospital auxiliary along with routine club and district activities.

The Fallbrook Woman's Club has been involved in the heart of our community since our inception over 100 years ago. We continue our volunteer activities both locally and as part of Palomar District 24. Our members continue to serve on the District Board of Directors. We hope you will consider joining us!

WHAT IS THE FALLBROOK WOMAN'S CLUB?

We are a non-profit, community service organization, which provides an opportunity to develop leadership skills, exchange ideas and form friendships, while addressing the needs of our community.

WHAT IS THE GENERAL FEDERATION?

The General Federation of Women's Clubs is the largest and oldest international service organization of volunteer women in the world. GFWC's roots can be traced back to 1868 when Jane Croly, a professional journalist, was denied entrance to a dinner at an all-male press club. In response, she formed a woman's club—Sorosis. On April 24, 1890, 63 clubs officially formed the GFWC Clubs. Members are encouraged to focus their attention on local issues, but also take advantage of our national network of programs that have provided a framework of accomplishments and service.

WHAT IS THE CALIFORNIA FEDERATION?

California Federation of Women's Clubs, founded in 1910, is an organization of 22,500 members who belong to 265 clubs throughout California that unite women of all ages for community service and worldwide issues. There are 24 districts with four leadership areas. CFWC is responsible for contributing more than 1,000,000 volunteer hours, along with over \$7,000,000 on 8,663 projects annually. They provide resources and volunteers who work on numerous projects within six departments: Art, Conservation, Education, Home Life, International Affairs and Public Affairs.
