CLUB HISTORY

The Fallbrook Woman's Club (FWC), originally called the Saturday Afternoon Club, was founded in 1907 by a small group of women who lived in the surrounding farm community. They would come into town with their husbands on Saturdays. Although they came from diverse backgrounds, they had a common bond with their dedication to community improvements through volunteer service. They quickly became an important influence in our village.

In 1917, the Club sponsored the first Girl Scout Troop (White Rose Troop No. 1) west of the Mississippi. In 1919, the Club founded the first public library in the area.

During World Wars I and II, members were involved in the care of hospitalized servicemen, contributed countless hours to the American Red Cross, organized the local U.S.O. and offered first aid classes. During the Vietnam War, a blood bank was maintained at our clubhouse.

1951 was a monumental year for the Fallbrook Woman's Club, as members were able to purchase the present site. They also happily accepted an 1872 side-loading carriage, donated by the founding Heald family. This carriage, recently refurbished, has become a village landmark.

The Fallbrook Woman's Club has been involved in the heart of our community since our inception over 116 years ago. We continue our volunteer activities both locally and as part of Palomar District of the California Federation of Woman's Clubs.

WHAT IS GFWC?

The General Federation of Women's Clubs International is the largest and oldest service organization of volunteer women in the world. GFWC's roots can be traced back to 1868 when Jane Croly, a professional journalist, was denied admittance to a dinner at an all-male press club honoring Charles Dickens. In response, she formed a women's club, Sorosis. In 1890, 63 clubs officially formed the GFWC Clubs. Members are encouraged to focus their attention on local issues, but also take advantage of the national network.
